Event	Effect(s) on Canada or Canadians	Positive or Negative Effect on the Development of Canada? Why?
World War I	<ul> <li>When the war ended in 1919, 60,000 Canadian soldiers had been killed.</li> <li>Canadians achieved a new worldwide identity for valour during the war.</li> <li>The efforts of Canadian soldiers in battle won the respect of nations worldwide.</li> </ul>	Positive: recognition for Canada as a nation; Canadians felt pride  Negative: huge losses of life
General Strike	<ul> <li>Workers stopped telephone and mail service, streetcars, and many other services.</li> <li>The government called in the police to end the strike; two workers were killed and many more injured.</li> </ul>	Positive: unions were developed, workers realized strength in numbers, new political parties began  Negative: loss of life, violence
Women's Suffrage Movement	<ul> <li>As women entered the workforce in large numbers, many became vocal on social issues.</li> <li>Women organized the suffrage movement to gain the same rights as men.</li> <li>Women held rallies and lobbied politicians to gain voting rights.</li> </ul>	Positive: women gained rights, women got to vote, women treated more equally, women recognized for their work during the war effort

Great Depression	<ul> <li>The economy slowed, factories closed, workers lost their jobs, wages fell, and many lost their life savings.</li> <li>Men travelled across Canada looking for work, and many families had no income.</li> <li>Western Canada was hit very hard because several years of drought forced people to leave their farms.</li> <li>During the 1930s, more people left the Prairies than arrived.</li> </ul>	Positive: new political parties appeared that had new ideas, introduction of social programs after the Depression (old-age pension, employment insurance, family allowance, public health care)  Negative: people lost jobs and savings, some people lost lives
World War II	<ul> <li>Work once again became plentiful because new war industries needed workers.</li> <li>42 000 Canadians died in the war, and another 54 000 were wounded.</li> </ul>	Positive: prosperity continued after the war  Negative: loss of life, violence
