- research and organize key facts, groups, ultranationalist policies, reasons and motivations that led to the genocide using the eight stages of genocide,

- demonstrate your research and understanding of ultranationalism and genocide through a
 multimedia presentation (including images/pictures, maps, audio, video, links,
 songs/poems/quotes, or other media), and
- respond to the following question.

How do we address the legacies left behind from acts of ultranationalism?

In the 4.6.2 Ultranationalism and Genocide assignment, you will research how ultranationalism leads to genocide. Then, you will create a multimedia presentation to explain the stages and aftermath of genocide and what legacies ultranationalism can leave behind.

Before beginning the assignment, review course content pages 4.6.1-1 and 4.6.1-2, as well as the Eight Stages and 4.6.1 Notebook Organizers.

TASK:

- Step 1: Choose ONE genocide from the list provided on content page 4.6.2. Contact your teacher if you have another suggestion.
- Step 2: Research and organize your information according to the eight stages of genocide. You must summarize the information obtained from your research in your own words, and you must record at least three research sources.
- Step 3: Organize your research into a multimedia presentation (choosing from a variety of images/pictures, maps, audio, video, links, songs/poems/quotes, or other media).
- **Step 4: Respond to the focus question** as part of your research chart and multimedia presentation.





Step 1: Choose ONE case of genocide from course content page 4.6.2 (under the tab labelled "Suggested Research Sites") **as the focus for your research**.

Step 2: (/20) Research and organize your information according to the eight stages of genocide. Review content page 4.6.1-1, if needed. Remember, you must summarize the information obtained from your research in your own words, and you must record your sources.

Using point-form, conduct research from the *Understanding Nationalism* textbook (if applicable) and other sources to show the development of your chosen genocide according to the eight stages of genocide.

Step 3: (/20) Organize your research into a multimedia presentation, including a variety of images/pictures, maps, audio, video, links, songs/poems/quotes, or other media. Consider the eight stages of genocide, chronological order (ex. months or years), or other layout to organize your presentation.

The multimedia presentation must include the following.

- An initial position on the question, How do we address the legacies left behind from acts of ultranationalism?
- **Key facts** from your Step 2 research chart (who/what/when/where/why/how)
- **An explanation of** important events, key groups or individuals, reasons, motivations, and factors that led to the genocide. The explanation may also be submitted as an audio file.
- Connection between the events and motivations of the genocide to the characteristics of ultranationalism.

Characteristics of Ultranationalism

- Extreme sense of national identity
- Little respect for the national identity of others
- Extreme patriotism, and country can never be wrong
- Has no regard for minority group rights
- Accepts only people from preferred ethnic group(s), and denies rights to all others
- Tends to be racist and have a fanatical devotion to country
- Foreign policy actions are taken without regard for the impact they have on other nations
- Seeks to dominate where conflict arises
- National interest has little or no consideration for global implications
- Suggestions of how nations and the global community should have reacted to prevent such human rights abuses at the point of the genocide, and how nations and the global community can learn for the future
- A clear layout and organization of information from your Step 2 research chart (which can include maps, pictures/images, sound clips, video, links, quotes, poems, novel/movies)
- Sources, references, or website links where you found multimedia files

Step 4: Respond to the focus question below, based on the overview of the genocide at the end of your multimedia presentation. This response may also be submitted as an audio file with your explanation in Step 3.
