Words with Two Meanings

Read the following examples:

notice: The *notice* said the meeting was today.

Did you *notice* my new shoes?

print: Jeff's *print* is hanging on the wall.

I *print* my name on all my work.

Find the two meanings of each word listed in the chart below (use a dictionary if necessary). As in the examples, write a sentence for each one to demonstrate the meaning.

When you finish writing your sentences, notice what differences you observed between the two meanings of each word. (**Hint:** Think about parts of speech.) Record your observations in the third column of the chart.

Word	Meanings	Observations
play	1. I want to go play outside. 2. My mom took me to see the play at the theatre.	First is a verb, second is a noun.
lock	1. I locked the door as I left the house. 2. The hair stylist cut off a lock of my hair.	First is a verb, second is a noun.
dust	1. The dust from under my bed made me sneeze. 2. Dad asked me to dust the piano.	First is a noun, second is a verb.
spy	1. I watched a movie about a man who was a spy. 2. I spied a shiny object on the sidewalk.	First is a noun, second is a verb.
