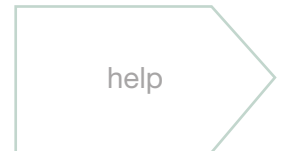
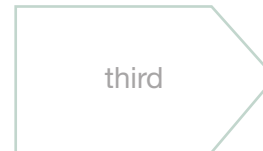
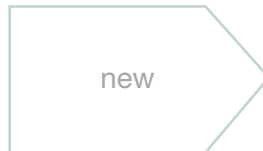
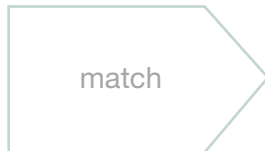
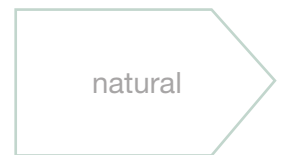
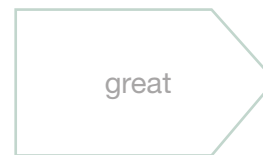
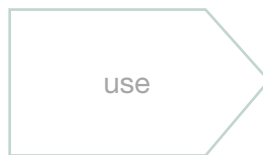
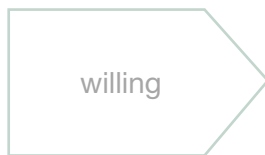
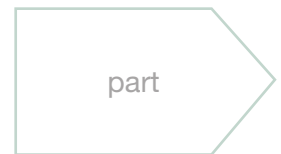
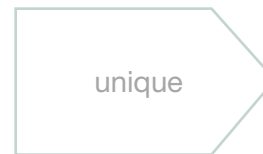
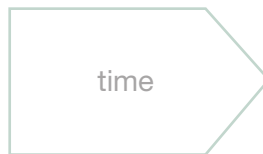
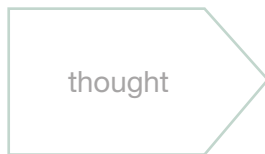
## Suffixes Have Meaning

Root Word	Word with Suffix
Example: Help – to aid	Helpless – without help or aid
Thought – an idea	Thoughtless – without thought or ideas
Time – part of the day	Timely – well-timed
Unique – special, different, one of a kind	Timeless – without age
Part – section of	Uniquely – being unique
Willing – agreeable to do something	Partly – to some degree
Use – purpose	Willingly – done in a willing manner
Great – large; wonderful	Willingness – agreeableness
Natural – formed by nature	Useless – without use or purpose
Match – equals or resembles another	Greatly – to a great degree
New – of recent origin	Greatness – achieved importance
Third – after the second	Naturally – in a natural or normal manner
	Matchless – without equal
	Newly – recently
	Newness – being new
