1. After the opening paragraph: What caused the Russians to explore the west coast.

The Russians traded with the First Nations living there.

2. After the first two paragraphs of Explorers by Sea: What information is important?

Spanish explorers came from Mexico in 1774 to expand trading routes; an explorer from Europe named George Vancouver explored the area from present-day Vancouver Island to Alaska.

3. After the next paragraph: Why might the writer have focused on George Vancouver?

Vancouver charted hundreds of inlets, bays, and islands from Vancouver Island to Alaska.

4. After the first three paragraphs of Explorers by Land: What is important about the exploration of land?

It took a long time to explore this area because explorers had to go through the Rocky Mountains; explorers who made this journey were Mackenzie, Thompson, and Fraser.

5. At the end: What did this exploration mean for Canada?

This exploration meant that the map of the region was taking shape and trade between the East and the West increased.
