Frayer Model Courage Chart

Instructions

- View the [Frayer Model Tutorial](#) again as review.
- You are going to fill in a **Frayer Model** with words that help explain what courage is.
- You can fill in the boxes in any order that you like. Perhaps start with non-examples.
- In **Definition**, type what you think a good definition of courage would be. You do not have to do this first – you may wait until you have done all the other boxes before you create your definition.
- Under **Characteristics**, type words or phrases that describe courage.
- Under **Examples**, list examples of courage. Think of what the characters in the stories did that displayed courage to use as examples. Other examples would be acceptable too.
- Under **Non-examples**, type things that show us what courage is *not*. These will be examples of the opposite of courage.
- Do the definition last.
