Frayer Model Courage Chart

Instructions

- View the Frayer Model Tutorial again as review.
- You are going to fill in a Frayer Model with words that help explain what courage is.
- You can fill in the boxes in any order that you like. Perhaps start with non-examples.
- In Definition, type what you think a good definition of courage would be. You do not have to do this first you may wait until you have done all the other boxes before you create your definition.
- Under Characteristics, type words or phrases that describe courage.
- Under Examples, list examples of courage. Think of what the characters in the stories did that displayed courage to use as examples. Other examples would be acceptable too.
- Under Non-examples, type things that show us what courage is *not*. These will be examples of the opposite of courage.
- Do the definition last.
