Frayer Model Courage Chart

Instructions

- You are going to fill in a **Frayer Model** with words that help explain what courage is.
- In Definition, type what you think a good definition of courage would be. You do not have to do this first – you may wait until you have done all the other boxes before you create your definition.
- Under **Characteristics**, type words or phrases that describe courage.
- Under **Examples**, list examples of courage. Think of what the characters in the stories did that displayed courage to use as examples. Other examples would be acceptable too.
- Under **Non-examples**, type things that show us what courage is *not*. These will be examples of the opposite of courage.
