Three facts learned about a "dino-mite camp" are that participants cook and eat outdoors and sleep in Teepees; students hike to different activities and use tools the scientists use to dig dinosaur bones and fossils; students make a cast of dinosaur teeth; students learn a lot about dinosaurs.
2.	Write a statement or conclusion about this summer camp from your synthesized information.	Students at a "dino-mite camp" learn a lot about dinosaurs through active participation: by hiking to areas in which they lived, digging with special tools, and making casts of teeth and bones.
