Read "Location" to find out about the area of the sanctuary.	Why can visitors not enter by land? What other places is it close to? How many people can visit?
Read "Wildlife" to find out what natural features and wildlife there is.	What other wildlife might I find there? What special name has been given to the park?
Read "Origin" to find out how this sanctuary got started.	How did this sanctuary get started? Who helps the government manage the sanctuary?
