Different people can have different ways of thinking about the same things, these are called opinions. For example, you may think that you would rather visit the Grizzly Sanctuary instead of the Marine Park because you find grizzly bears more fascinating.

If you remember, protected parks means that government agencies look after the parks because of their natural beauty and wildlife there. It is sometimes hard for tourists to see these places and enjoy what they have to offer. They are protected because they do not want people to get hurt or to harm the environment there. The following chart is a plus and minus chart. Review and think about how you feel about having tourists in protected parks. Then list three reasons tourists should be allowed in protected parks (plus) and three reasons why tourists should not be allowed there (minus).
