Where will you find this landform?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- if you hike through Gros Morne, you could walk on what once was a beach or ocean floor- this is a mountainous region with lots of forest- you will find this in the National Park in Newfoundland
The Natural Wonder of Niagara Falls	
What does the author want you to remember about this landform? What type of landform is this? Where will you find this landform?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- formed from an underground cliff- water goes over falls at 69km an hour- fastest flowing rapids- this is a waterfall- you will find this at Niagara Falls, Ontario

Canada's Rainforest	
<p>What does the author want you to remember about this landform?</p> <p>What type of landform is this?</p> <p>Where will you find this landform?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - rainforests are home to millions of plants and animals and are important to our planet - this is a rainforest - this goes from North California to Glacier Bay in Alaska - part of the forest is Great Bear Rainforest in B.C.
Magnificent Hoodoos of the Badlands	
<p>What does the author want you to remember about this landform?</p> <p>What type of landform is this?</p> <p>Where will you find this landform?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - hoodoos can be the height of an average person or taller than a ten story building - tall, skinny rocks that make interesting shapes - made of layers of sandstone - you will find this is the Badlands of Alberta/dry areas

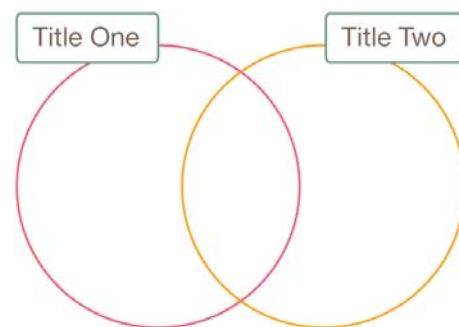
Venn Diagram
