1. Postage Regulations


Do not enclose letters with Assignment Booklets.

Value Assignment I 50

Make a drawing showing a group of objects which are indoors or outdoors, real or imaginary. Your eye level should cross all or some of the objects. Some of the objects should overlap and some should have parallel level edges. Use two-point perspective. Add shadows to your drawing. Use a vanishing point for the cast shadows on level surfaces.

Draw on a large sheet of the ledger paper so there is room for your vanishing points some of which may well be out of your drawings' area. Use a ruler to get correct perspective by first drawing lightly pencilled guide lines to the vanishing points. Erase these lines from your finished drawing but not outside the drawing.

Value Assignment II 50

On another large sheet of ledger paper draw the same group of objects as in your Assignment I. Draw the objects either above or below your eye level. Use two-point perspective for the level lines and a vanishing point for the vertical lines. Add shadows. Use a vanishing point for cast shadows seen on level surfaces.

Follow the same procedure for this drawing as you did for the drawing in Assignment I. See the second paragraph of Assignment I above.

Use box-like objects for these assignments. Parallel edges work best as well.
