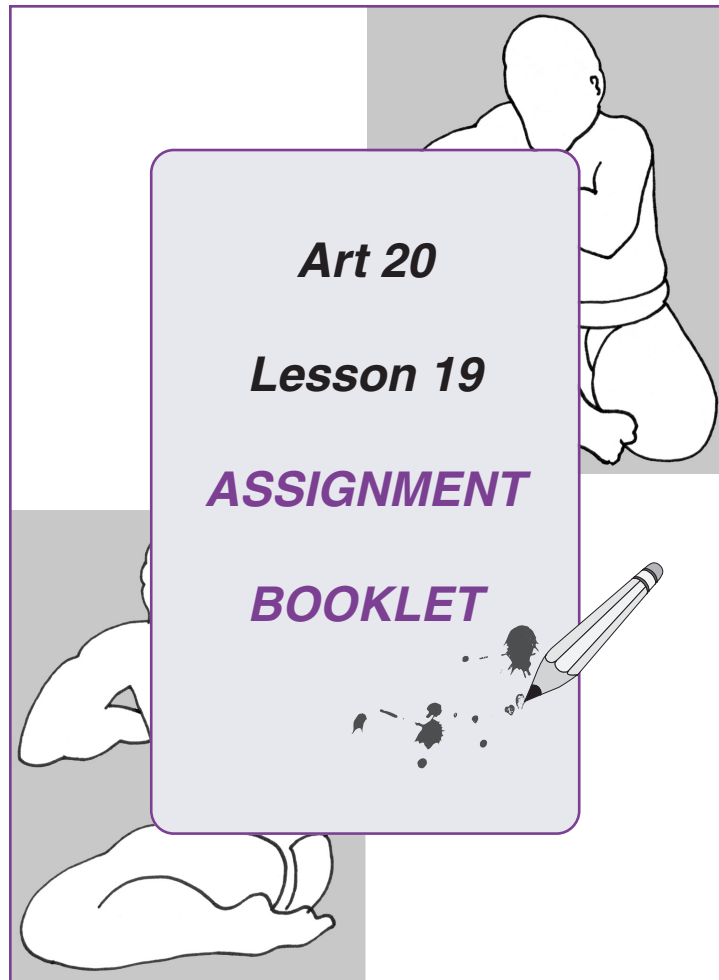

Create an additive or subtractive sculpture of an animal or person. Include at least one negative area and some incised or painted texture/pattern in your statue. Show modelled (bulged) surfaces for a more natural, three dimensional look.

Hint: Dry modelled statues carefully. Sand rough edges. Ensure painted surfaces are dry before packaging the statue.
