Assignment I: 40 Marks

- Creation of large areas of three different tones.
- Creation of large areas of three textures or use of three materials with real textures e.g. velvet, sandpaper, denim etc.
- Created tones and textures should be cut out and arranged, as a collage, on a sheet of thick art paper at least 8" x 11" or larger.
- The design of the collage can be semi-abstract, abstract, or non-objective.
- The textures and tones should cover the entire sheet of art paper.
- Collage should contain one area of each tone and texture so balance can be maintained.
- Use of at least six different simulated/actual materials.


Assignment II: 60 Marks (15 Marks for each Drawing)

- Drawing #1: Naturalistic drawing of any animal.
- Drawing #2: Redraw same animal in circular format frame (see assignment instructions) drawing should conform to circular shape.
- Drawing #3: Redraw same animal in rectangular format frame (see assignment instructions) the Positive Area should be shaded for the rectangular format drawing should conform to rectangular shape.
- Drawing #4: Redraw same animal in either a square or triangular format frame (see assignment instructions) drawing should conform to either the square or triangle shape.
- Each drawing should be spaced well into the respective shape and it should harmonize with its three different formats.
- All artwork should be labelled (on back) with student's full name, course name, Assignment Booklet # and Assignment #.
