

  - Did you complete the Assignment Booklet cover and attach the correct label?


#### **Preparing the Assignment Booklet**

### Value Assignment 2: A Pastiche 50

Choose an image from list indicated in Assignment 1 and create a composition in a 'pastiche' of the artist's style. A 'pastiche' is a work of art that is created as an intentional imitation of another artist's style. Thus, a pastiche is to be created as a direct copy of a specific artwork, to assist you to learn the specific techniques and qualities of an individual artist. For your pastiche, you may choose to use any media of your choice (it does not have to be the same media as the original artist used) – the idea of this activity is to replicate the style and textural qualities of the original artist's artwork. For example, many students find that using oil pastels is a great way to achieve similar oil paint qualities. Please ensure that you provide (on the back of your artwork) the name of the artist and artwork you are copying.

**Note:** This is the only time in Art 30 that you are permitted to copy the style and subject matter of another artist.

### Value Assignment 3: What is Your Style? 25

Create a drawing/composition in your own style. You may use any media of your choice. Include a brief written critique of yur artwork that evaluates its quality in terms of the art elements listed in Assignment 1, as well a brief description of your artwork, including a title, media used and any other details to describe your artwork, including the process you employed in its creation.

#### **Points to Ponder:**

- 1. Have I thoroughly discussed all art elements for both chosen artists?
- 2. Have I discussed artists chosen from the list?
- 3. How well have I integrated the chosen artist's styles into my own pastiche drawing? (Assignment 2)
- 4. Have I included a drawing in my own style? How would I rate its quality in terms of the art elements described above? (Colour may be used, but it should not be the main criterion for your own evaluation.) Attach your critique to the back of your drawing.
