


3.3 Rhythm and Rhyme

Edgar Allan Poe - “Annabel Lee”

1. Give the rhyme scheme of this stanza of the poem (use capital letters for rhyme scheme). /1

1. Syllables are the division of words where each unit will have a single vowel. When you look a word up in the dictionary, you will see the syllable breaks. A simple way to count syllables is to read/say a word slowly and count the syllables on your fingers as you read.

Examples: Read (1 syllable)

Read--ing (2 syllables)

To-day(2), I (1) will(1) be (1) read-ing (2) and (1) writ-ing(2). = 10 syllables in this line.

Satisfactory	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Topic sentence addresses the given topic, but could be more specific • You have included at least 3 supporting sentences • Your closing sentence is present, but could be more effective • Sentence structure, word choice, and mechanics have errors but the communication is basically clear
Limited	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Topic sentence does not address the given topic specifically • You have included fewer than 3 supporting sentences • Your closing sentence does not sum up the paragraph • Sentence structure, word choice, and mechanics have too many errors
