The Report – What needs to be in your report?

1. Minimum length of 2, double-spaced, typed pages. Maximum length of 4, double-spaced, typed pages.

/2 marks

2. Short introductory paragraph which clearly identifies the case you have chosen, and why you feel it relates to Canadian Private (Civil) Law.

/2 marks

3. A summary of the events of the topic you have chosen.

/10 marks

Your summary MUST include the following:

- **Who** is the case about?
- **What** happened?
- **Where** did the events take place?
- **When** did the events take place?
- **Why** did the events take place – in other words, what caused the events to happen?

4. Your opinion of the case.

/6 marks

Your opinion MUST include the following:

- If a legal decision was reached, do you agree or disagree with it?
- If a legal decision was reached, **why** do you agree or disagree with it?
- If no legal decision was reached, what would **you** decide, and **why**?
- Which facts/events in the case did **you** find the most interesting, and **why**?

5. One concluding paragraph.

Your concluding paragraph MUST include the following:

- a) **4 Private Law legal concepts**, of your choice, **from the course**.
- b) Explain how **each** concept relates directly to this case.

6. Cite your sources.

Choice #2 – Video (Save as an MP4 file so you can upload into Moodle)**(Graded out of 30 marks)**

You are going to act out a **scenario that relates directly to Canadian Private (Civil) Law**. Be sure that your **topic is school appropriate**. If you are unsure, contact your lead teacher for assistance.

- a) You **may choose one of the following** on which to base your scenario:
 - o Choose an actual case to act out;
 - o Choose an episode of a TV program to act out;
 - o Choose an article, a short story, or a portion of a novel to act out;
 - o Based on a concept or concepts from the course, make up your own scenario to act out.
- b) Your **video must include; 5 Specific Canadian Private (Civil) Law legal concepts from the course**.
- c) Your video does not have to be done with any fancy equipment. **As long as we can clearly see and hear your video**, that is all that is required. We are not expecting Academy Award-winning acting. Just **relax and have fun with this!** (Yet school appropriate, of course.)
- d) You may enlist the help of anyone you wish for this video – friends, classmates, family, etc. Anyone you wish can be in this video with you.
- e) Feel free to put a humorous slant on your scenario if you wish.

The Video – What needs to be in your video?

1. Introduction – Tell us the following:

- a) Your name
- b) The topic you have chosen
- c) The names of the people in your video
- d) The character(s) each person is playing in your video

2. Act out your scenario:

- a) Your video should be approximately 5 minutes long. No longer than 10 minutes and no less than 3 minutes.

- b) Your video sound must be clear throughout the entire video.

/2 marks

- c) We must be able to clearly see all parts of your video, throughout the entire video.

- d) The 5 Canadian Private (Civil) Law legal concepts you chose must clearly be covered in your video.

3. You have acted out your 5 Canadian legal concepts from the course. At the end of your video, **you need to clearly state the following:**

- a) What **5 specific Canadian Private (Civil) Law legal concepts from the course** did you include in your video?
