In Unit 5, you read a little bit about Species at Risk and that species preservation is important to forest health. Why do you think some species are at risk and others are not? What are some key factors that put them at risk and what role do humans play in this?

For Assignment #1, you will create a tri-fold brochure (3 panels) that will inform readers of the **value of species at risk**.

Step 1. Create a blank document, format your page for Landscape, and then insert 3 columns. Remember, you will need to use 2 pages as one will be the inside of your brochure and the other will be the back. You should have information on each panel.



Step 2. Select a species currently designated at risk by COSEWIC (Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada) by going to the **website**.

Step 3. Scroll down and click on Search by Species.

Step 4. Set the **Range to Alberta**, choose the taxonomic group of your choice, and set the **COSEWIC Status to Threatened**.

- **Step 5.** Once the list of threatened species appears, click on a threatened species of your choice.
- **Step 6.** Research and write the information, of your chosen Species at Risk, on your brochure panels.
- **Step 7.** When entering the information on your brochure, you <u>must</u> use your own words; it is not acceptable to copy and paste the information into your brochure. If you do not use your own words, you will receive a zero on the assignment and be required to resubmit your brochure. You will find the ADLC Plagiarism Policy in the Course Overview, in the Table of Contents.
- **Step 8.** Your brochure will be marked according to the Brochure Rubric at the bottom of this page.

Your brochure **must** include the following:

- A title page with the name of your chosen Species at Risk
- A minimum of 2 pictures of this species
- Detailed information about your Species at Risk
- An explanation of the value of this species
- The reason(s) that this species is threatened
- Convincing arguments why this species should be protected and conserved
- The issues that are preventing this species from recovering its population
- The various groups (government, non-government) that are involved in its recovery
