The population of indigenous people in the Americas	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Enslaved by invaders2. Died from new diseases for which they had no immunity3. Massive numbers killed by European invaders
Cultures of indigenous people in the Americas	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Cultural practices often forbidden2. Religious practices forbidden – expected to become Christian3. Art and other cultural artifacts taken or destroyed4. Expected to speak the language of the invaders
European sense of identity	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. European nations became very powerful, and saw themselves as very important.2. People began to take pride in accomplishments that they regarded as national accomplishments.3. Nationalism emerged and grew.
European economy	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. European nations became rich and powerful.2. Trade increased from the New World and the rest of the known world.3. European worldview caused the exploitation of the New World to continue for many years.
