Assignment 3-1 Weather Broadcast

What Do I Know About a Weather Event?

Instructions

- 1. Choose a weather phenomenon or event such as storm, blizzard, tornado, hurricane, chinook, drought, flood etc.
- 2. Watch the daily news to learn how to do a weather broadcast and to learn the vocabulary terms such as weather watch, advisory, and warning.
- 3. Do an Internet search to learn about the weather phenomenon.

Create a "Weather Event or Phenomenon" broadcast.

- Present a forecast to the public that provides a clear explanation of your weather phenomenon
- Identify the location of this weather phenomenon
- Include appropriate vocabulary for the weather event that you have chosen such as temperature, wind speed and direction, barometric pressure, and humidity or precipitation, warm front, cold front etc.
- Provide information about how your weather phenomenon will affect people (For example, is it dangerous? If it is dangerous, what can people do to prepare, be safe, and avoid or survive it?)
- Include an image (photo or drawing) of your weather phenomenon.
