Social Studies 30-1: Rejections of Liberalism

4.2.9 Conflicting Ideologies Assignment

In this section, you considered the impact of ideological conflict on international affairs, by studying the impact of the Cold War from 1945-1991. Many strategies were employed by both sides as the conflicting ideologies of liberal democracy and communist totalitarianism strove for ideological domination.

In this two-part assignment, you will use your knowledge and understanding of the Cold War, combined with your creativity to construct an illustrated digital photo album. Be sure to review all the readings from this section before you complete this assignment, as well as Chapter 7 pages 234-260 in your textbook.

Step One: Define the methods of Cold War Conflict

In your own words, summarize how each of the following methods used to maintain the ideological conflict between the United States and the Soviet Union. Your explanation of each method needs to demonstrate an accurate understanding of the term as it related to the Cold War. Each correctly defined/explained method is worth 2 marks each.

Step Three: Pair your method and example with an appropriate image.

Step Four: Organize your methods, examples and images into a coherent presentation.

Organize the terms into a digital photo album that makes chronological sense of these Cold War methods and events.

For example, when did expansionism largely occur? Hint: Near the beginning of the Cold War in Eastern Europe.

Step Five:

Decide upon a format that will effectively present the 'story' of these Cold War methods, examples and relevant illustrations. This can be in the format of an illustrated dictionary format (see below), a digital photo album or an audio-visual. Remember, you want to tell the 'story' of the Cold War as an ideological conflict between the liberal democratic United States and the Soviet Russia.

While your definitions/explanation are marked for accuracy, include these in your presentation. In other words, Steps 1-4 must be placed into a compelling presentation.
