Subject-Verb Agreement Review

This is how the verb to speak is conjugated in English.

to speak					
I	speak	We	speak		
You	speak	You	speak		
He, She, It	speak s	They	speak		

In English, we see a difference in the third person singular: he, she, which is the **s**.

In Spanish, there are different endings for each person. To conjugate the verb, first we take off the ending of the verb. In this case is **–ar**, and we are left with the **stem**.

For example: the verb **hablar**, we take off **-ar** and the stem is **habl**. To this stem, we add the new endings and each person has its own ending.

Yo habl Nosotros/Nosotras habl	hablar → to speak				
T'	-				
Tú habl Vosotros/Vosotras habl	_				
Él - he habl Ellos - they habl Ella - she habl Ellas - they habl Usted - you habl Ustedes – you guys habl	-				

Remember that Yo hablo can be used as I speak or I am speaking.

Now you try it. Here are the verbs **escuchar** and **estudiar**. Conjugate these verbs in the tables below on your paper. When you are finished, go to the course to see the answers.

escuchar → to listen

estudiar →
