## Additional Subject-Verb Agreement

This is how the verb to speak is conjugated in English.

to speak					
I	speak	We	speak		
You	speak	You	speak		
He, She, It	speaks	They	speak		

In English, we see a difference in the third person singular: he, she, which is the **s**.

In Spanish, there are different endings for each person. To conjugate the verb, first we take off the ending of the verb. In this case is **-ar**, and we are left with the **stem**.

For example: the verb **hablar**, we take off **-ar** and the stem is **habl**. To this stem, we add the new endings and each person has its own ending.

hablar → to speak					
Yo	habl	Nosotros/Nosotras	habl		
Tú	habl	Vosotros/Vosotras	habl		
Él/Ella/Usted	habl	Ellos/Ellas/Uds	habl
