Country of Origin - Criteria guideline

Using the Internet, books, atlases, your relatives, etc., find out as much as you can about your selected country... concentrating on these factors: (it is okay if you cannot answer them all).

- 1. Your ancestral location of origin (where your ancestors lived within the chosen country) and the <u>main history</u> of the country (particularly at the time your ancestor(s) lived or left there). Be sure to include:
 - any historical developments that led to the country's present status or situation
 - famous or important people, historical figures from that country, and for what they were/are famous
 - pictures of famous people or leaders of the country
 - any major conflicts that have occurred in that country such as civil or world war that helped to define the country today.
- 2. The <u>geography</u> of the country (use an online atlas for this section, such as http://www.atlapedia.com) Try and use at least 2-3 sources for this section.
 - its regions, mountain ranges, large lakes, rivers, oceans, etc.
 - its relative location (definitions below)
 - What is the difference between relative and absolute location? Relative location means to locate a place relative to other landmarks while absolute location is locating a place using a coordinate system.
 - its climate in the winter and summer, overall yearly temperature
 - a relief map of the country showing its geography, and a map showing major cities, rivers, lakes, etc.
 - the main cultural, language and religious groups of the country
 - population of this country
 - unique qualities of this country's people
 - main languages spoken
 - main religions
 - foods, animals, vegetation
 - fruit are native to this country
 - graphics showing cultural, and/or religious aspects of the country
- 3. The <u>current political and economic climate</u> of the country... for example, is it a war torn country?
 - style of government (communist, capitalistic, democratic, socialist)
 - current country leader, and his/her political party
 - main political and economic issues faced by the country
 - country's main industries (agriculture, mining, manufacturing, retail, etc)
 - country's GDP (Gross Domestic Product)
 - country's trade policy (regulations and agreements that control imports and exports to foreign countries such as NAFTA, CAFTA and the Middle Easter Trade Initiative)

4. A <u>conclusion/final analysis</u> comparing your country of origin to life in Canada today. Provide <u>specific examples or references</u> to answer the following: How is it similar? How is it different? Which country would you prefer to live in and why? (3 to 4 paragraphs)
